Center Quotes:

It has been a joy for 17 years serving our community, but unfortunately time and money are not on our side. Thank you for all that you have done for us at Celebration.

We will be at the building today and contacting insurance to assess damages to roof. We hope to reopen ASAP once the building is safe. Utilities are still out in the building. We have not been able to complete a thorough walk through of the building to assess damages.

We are doing everything in our Power along with our community support to open as early as Thursday for our working families.

The power loss and impassable roads is why our center has remained closed!

As most families and staff have not been able to enter the Keys to assess the damage, it is difficult to know what the outcome will be. Also, Marathon as a community has much work to do before it is safe for young children to arrive.

Grateful for no damage. Only electric loss.

We are able to open, have had all interior work repaired, waiting for roof repair (it only leaks when raining hard)

We are able to work around this inconvenience to service our community!

We need children in order to maintain our staff working

ECS informed us that OEL was not releasing the money for last month, we may or not receive payment or if we do receive payment it will be short. Now is not the time to withhold or shorten our money. I was paid short last month by over \$4000.00 and had to wait until the 20th of September to be paid now I won't be paid again? I have bills due and I need my money, my vendors are not interested in OEL not paying they want their money.

I foresee the biggest challenge for most centers that did not sustain damage is being able to pay employees/bills plus some lost revenue for the week missed. We just opened today (Mon, 9/18) and were just restored power last night. Our AC system did get fried in the storm.

We are lucky and blessed to say we are up and running with electricity and no damages thus far. Our parents were very happy to be able to bring their child to our school with cool temperature, a hot cooked meal and back to their regular routine. Our playground has no damages, as well. [...]

As most families and staff have not been able to enter the Keys to assess the damage, it is difficult to know what the outcome will be. Also, Marathon as a community has much work to do before it is safe for young children to arrive.

HAPPY KIDS is open & fully operational currently but we need financial aid to replace the awnings & play ground flooring that was damaged.



Kids Learning Center did not charge the parents that were unable to bring their children to school, during the week of Sept. 11 - Sept. 15.

Our facilities were open as shelters during the storm from Saturday thru Monday

We are having to replace \$2,500 worth of food. Lost most of our sand and mulch on our 1 acre play yards.

We are lucky and blessed to say we are up and running with electricity and no damages thus far. Our parents were very happy to be able to bring their child to our school with cool temperature, a hot cooked meal and back to their regular routine. Our playground has no damages, as well. The leaves and debris were cleared on Tuesday September 12th, 2017 so we can operate starting on Wednesday, September 13th, 2017. Happy to have some normalcy back. ??

We are open and would be glad to take children that are in need of an open center, any questions please email or call me. Thanks.

We did not charge the parents for the week. We experienced a \$5,000 loss of income from our private pay studnets. We have filed with our insurance.

We have been unable to reach five/14 teaching staff; our maintenance person also works for CCPS so he cannot fix shade or part of the roof, complexities associated with the boiled water notice; and whereabouts of staff.

We lost income due to families having to evacuate and not being here when we reopened on September 13th

We spend \$4200 in trees removal from the storm.

We don't have any financial means to replace what is lost.

Loss of tuition from all families at once and some students have not returned.

We lost power for a week and lost a lot of food.

If you are not able to help rebuild our playground. Is there another agency that will be able to help us?

The lack of power which includes our water because we operate on a well cost us an enrolled child. She needed to have child care.

I [would] like to say thank you for being concern of our duties as child care providers.

Thank for helping my program, it made my kids happy.

Insurance did not cover any of the damage.
