NEW HAMPSHIRE COUNTY-LEVEL CHILD CARE COSTS

Methodology

Child care costs are reported at the county-level for infant child care and child care for 4-year-olds where available across the state. To determine the affordability of child care costs by county, we compared the average cost of center-based child care to household median income by county. Affordability was calculated by dividing the average cost of care in that county by the county's median income as reported by the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey.

Findings

Throughout New Hampshire, center-based infant child care is least affordable in the less populous *Sullivan*, *Carroll* and *Coos* counties. The same seems to be true for family child care for infants - costs in less populated areas of the state, with fewer child care options, have less affordable child care costs.

As in previous years, the costs of center-based care across counties follow a normal distribution compared to the statewide average cost of care, meaning half of counties are more affordable than the statewide average and half are less affordable than the statewide average.

Affordability of family child care was relatively consistent throughout New Hampshire, meaning that county costs did not differ dramatically from the state average.
